MEMORIAL DAY

"No greater love has any man than this, that he lay down his life for his friends." John 15:13

"Do nothing from selfish ambition or conceit, but in humility regard others as better than yourselves. 4 Let each of you look not to your own interests, but to the interests of others. 5 Let the same mind be in you that was in Christ Jesus, 6 who, though he was in the form of God, did not regard equality with God as something to be exploited, 7 but emptied himself, taking the form of a slave, being born in human likeness. And being found in human form, 8 he humbled himself and became obedient to the point of death— even death on a cross." Philippians 2:3-8

This weekend, we celebrate Memorial Day. Though, it doesn't always seem appropriate to me to speak of it as a celebration. It is rather a day when we stop to give thanks and contemplate the depth of sacrifice made by women and men who gave their lives while serving in our armed forces. Paul wrote in Romans that "rarely would a person die even for a good person," but countless numbers have been willing to die for our country, the values of justice and freedom, and maybe most importantly, the women and men who serve beside them. The old saying that "freedom isn't free" remains true.

No one understood the concept of dying to save the lives of others more than Jesus. His death bought our freedom from the power of sin and death. He, in turn, taught that anyone who would be his follower had to be willing to "deny themselves, and take up their cross and follow." For followers of Jesus, sacrifice is a main discipline of the spiritual life. We are challenged to answer the call to self-denial and put others before ourselves. Sacrifice, however, is not just a discipline; it is a lifestyle that develops from a heart and mind transformed by the power of Christ living in us. Our goal is that while sacrifice may begin through self-discipline, our hope is that, in time, it will flow naturally from us in every aspect of our lives. It is then that we will truly have learned what it means to love.

Christian Swails, Wesley Gardens Spiritual Director


